



AFL HUNTER COAST TRANSFER GUIDELINES

It is accepted that intra league transfers are a natural occurrence in junior football, but only if a valid reason is presented by the player wishing to transfer clubs.

Some examples of a transfer, in which a Regional Committee may approve, include:

- Player moves his/her place of residence, which places him/her in the zone of another club.
- Player moves to a different school, making training attendance at a different club more sustainable for him/her.
- Internal conflict at the player's previous club, making it unmanageable for that player to remain at his/her previous club.
- Change of family circumstances, whereby it is more appropriate for a player to play at a different club.
- A new player to the region registers with a club, without knowing there is a club closer to his/her residence, is able to transfer to their zoned club.

Some examples of a transfer, in which a Regional Committee may not approve, include:

- Player wishing to play in a stronger team or club.
- Player wishing to play under a Swans Academy, TPP or Representative Coach.
- Player wishing to transfer to a different club, to strengthen his/her perceived chances of making representative squads.
- Player wishing to transfer clubs, as a result of being approached by an official or parent of this club.
- Player wishing to play with friends made through Swans Academy, TPP or Representative Football.
- Player not being able to provide information on why he/she is requesting the transfer.
